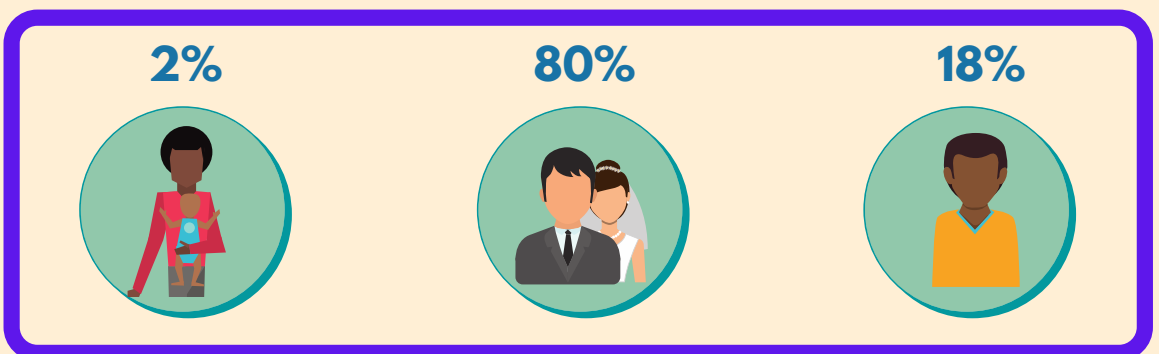
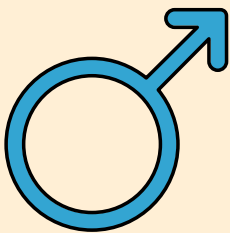
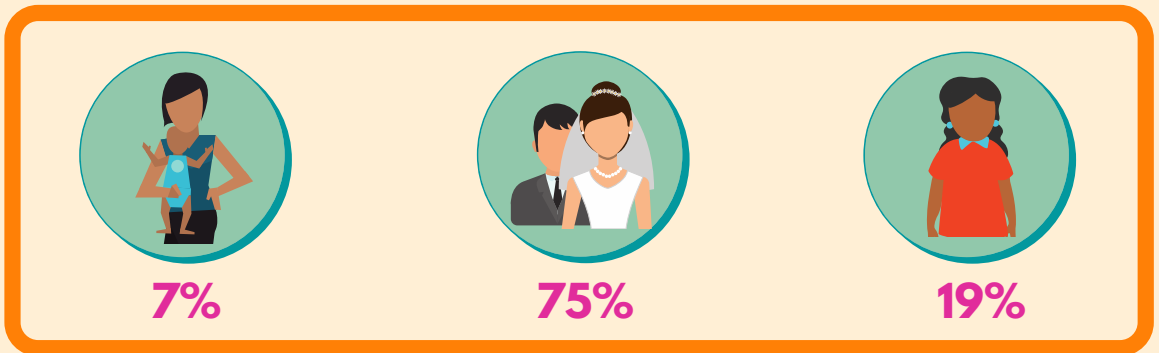
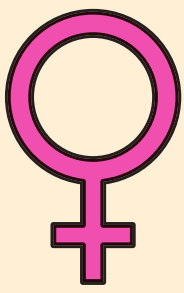


89% of 500 people were responded the survey by submitting online questionnaire.

male respondents are living with parents only



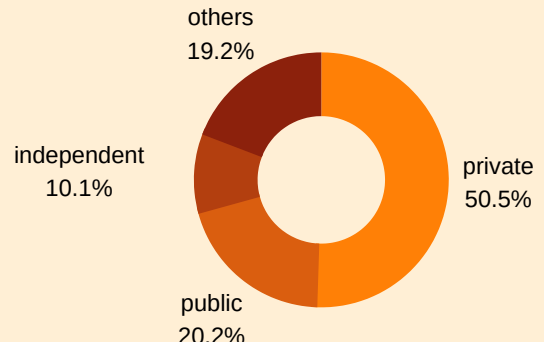
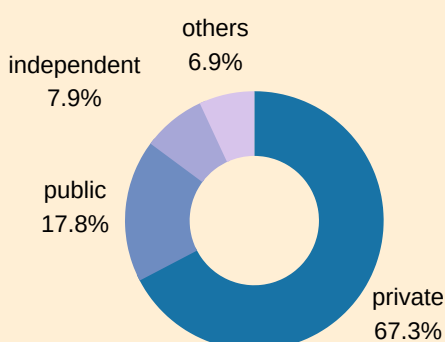

Respondents' Type of Workers



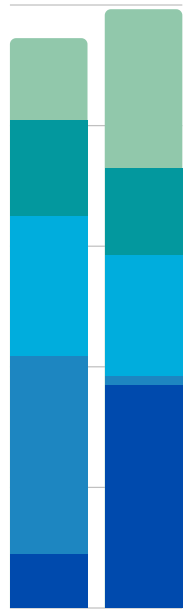
Most respondents are private sector employees. The independent workers are freelancers, self-employed, or other.



Respondents' Domestic Role & Responsibilities



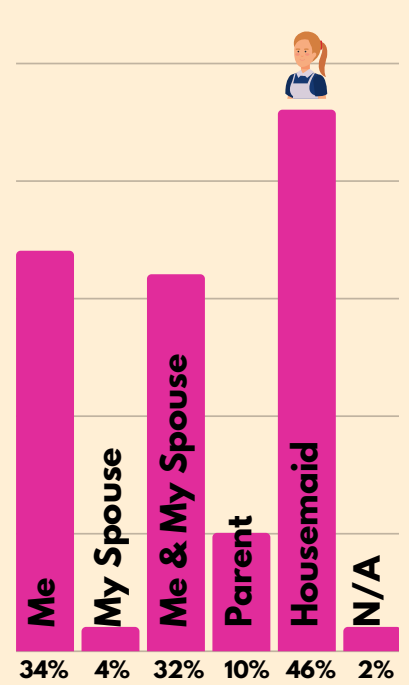
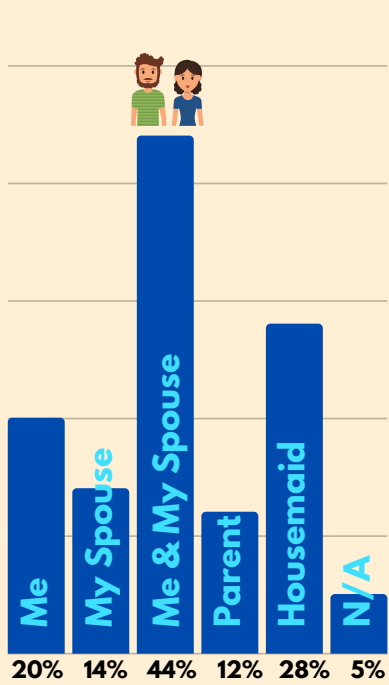
There are only 11% of male respondents who prepare the food at home. 41% male respondents admit that their spouse who prepare the food.



Most female respondents prepare the food at 46%. 33% females admit that the housemaid who prepares the food while only 2% of females said their spouse who prepare food.
